

Ladder 1 update:

Fire Tech and Safety installed the new cascade and fill station on the ladder on Thursday Aug 30th. Training will be conducted during the September company trainings. The parts have been ordered for the outrigger repairs and should be completed within the next few weeks. On September 24th the truck will be headed north to Lakes Region Fire Apparatus for corrosion and paint repairs. This work is estimated to take between 10 and 12 weeks. As a result, we will have automatic mutual aid agreements with Amherst fire and Wilton fire. After considerable review, discussion and consideration the recommendation was to make only the necessary repairs to the ladder and move the replacement up rather than spend the entire amount approved by the voters this spring. This will save the town approximately seventy-five thousand dollars and be the more fiscally prudent course of action.

On Monday Aug 27th. the Board of Selectmen expressed their appreciation and thanks to TA Scaife and myself. I shared with them that this was a team effort and they asked me to extend their thanks to everyone involved in this process. Thank you to; DC Britton, Capt Kincaid, Capt. Flaherty, FF Brooks, Tom Stepney for all your time and effort devoted to the repairs to Ladder 1.

MFD Awarded Fire Act Grant:

We have been informed that we have received a Assistance to Firefighters Grant in the amount of \$93,760. This is a regional grant for the Souhegan Mutual Aid (SMFAA) district and will provide a First InterComm® communications unit to each of the New Hampshire towns in SMFAA. These units will be demonstrated to the SMFAA chiefs at the quarterly meeting and be installed around the end of the year or very early next year. This device should be a great asset to the Souhegan region and enable us to communicate with the towns that are on low band as well as UHF

frequencies. Each unit costs approximately \$5000. The grant also covers the cost of training several personnel in each department. Here is a overview of the unit:

"The First InterComm System provides the link between land mobile radios operating on different frequencies and protocols right at the incident scene. Each responding agency simply installs a First InterComm unit that is configured for their communications device and frequency. The unit uses the radio frequency of that First Responder agency, runs off the vehicle's power, and requires no operator involvement. Once installed, the system provides seamless radio communications to all responding agencies at the scene that are also First InterComm enabled. And all Responders are able to use their existing radios." BAE website


